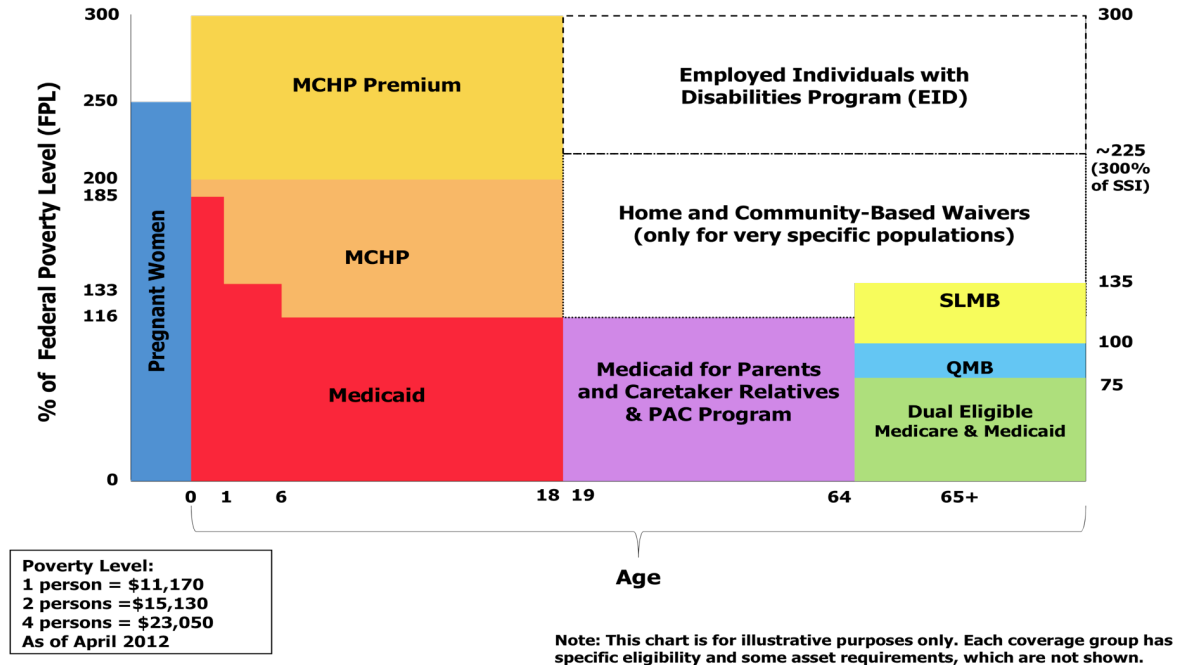


APPENDIX B: MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS.

Medical Assistance Program Coverage (Effective 04/01/12)



The Medical Assistance program coverage chart shows the coverage, depending upon age and income level, provided by various medical programs administered by Maryland’s Department of Health and Mental Hygiene. Coverage is provided for all pregnant women up to 250 percent of the federal poverty level (FPL). Medicaid covers all infants (0 to 1 year of age), in households with incomes below 185 percent of the FPL; all young children (1 to 6 years of age) in households with incomes below 133 percent of the FPL; and all older children and youths (6 to 18 years of age) in households with incomes up to 116 percent of the FPL.

Maryland’s Children’s Health Program (MCHP) covers children and youth (younger than 18 years

of age) living in households with incomes less than 200 percent of the FPL. Benefits are available, for a small premium, to all children between 200 and 300 percent of the FPL.

Adults younger than 65 years of age, not enrolled in Medicare, with incomes less than 116 percent of the FPL are covered by the Primary Adult Care program or Medicaid for parents and caretaker relatives program. Home and community-based waivers are available for specific adult populations up to about 225 percent of the FPL.

Older Marylanders (65 years of age and older) below 75 percent of the FPL are dually eligible for Medicaid and Medicare.
