

Part C in the Baltimore EMA

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Number of Grants

- There are 5 Part C grants in Maryland, with 3 of the 5 grantees are in the Baltimore EMA, with total funding of almost \$2.3 M for the EMA grantees.
- Part C can be used for all of the services that are covered by Part A or Part B, with the same restriction of a minimum of 75% of the services being within the Core services.
- There is a 10% administrative cap as well.

Purpose of Part C

- Part C funds comprehensive primary health care in an out patient setting.
- Most programs are considered “one-stop-shopping” programs, providing several needed services from the same provider.
- Funding goes directly to the provider organization vs. the EMA (Part A) or the State (Part B).

Patients Served

- In 2011, the Part C grant supporting efforts at Chase Brexton and Johns Hopkins Moore Clinic served a **total of 5,227 HIV+ patients, with 483 new patients to the service.** The services covered through this grant for these facilities include:

Reporting requirements with Part C

- The competitive grant is every 3 year
- Client level data is submitted annually through the Ryan White Services Report, as well as the Performance Narrative that is submitted with the non competitive grant renewal application annually.
