Questions from planning council members and guests on a Data Presentation at the April 17<sup>th</sup> planning council meeting. Responses from Danielle Lohan, Medicaid.

Question 1: What is included in Case Management? (Slide 10)

Response:

Technical [details on CM here](#). Assistance in gaining access to range of Medicaid services and additional needed services (medical, social, housing, financial, counseling, support). Include bio-psycho-social assessment, individual care plan, monitoring. Setting goals, helping to realize the goals. Assessment includes face to face assessment (at participant's residence if possible) to determine medical history, nutrition, emotional/behavioral status, health care coverage, living situation, support systems, education etc.

Question 2: If the household is 2 people and the income is \$22,715, is this yearly or monthly? This person is referring to slide 19 of the presentation, the graph on MAGI income Eligibility for adults. This person believes that the opening statement conflicts with the graph.

Response:

Question 3: What is the total Medicaid expenditure on HIV?

Response:

HIV only: ~\$4 million, HIV/AIDS: ~\$9 million. This is only reflective of the amount of money Medicaid pays toward a person's care, not a measure of how many services they have received or the cost of those services individually.
