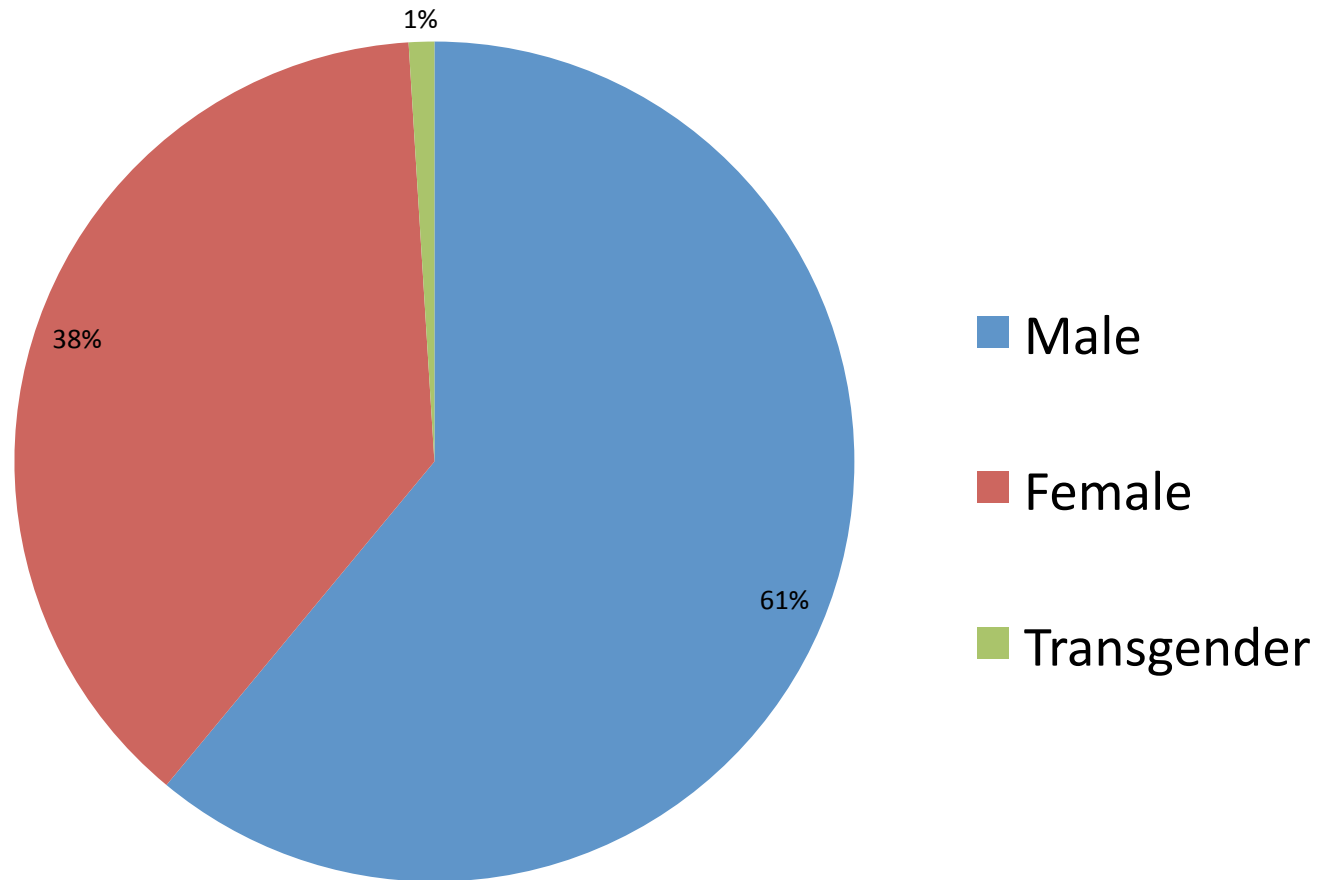

 - Missing data

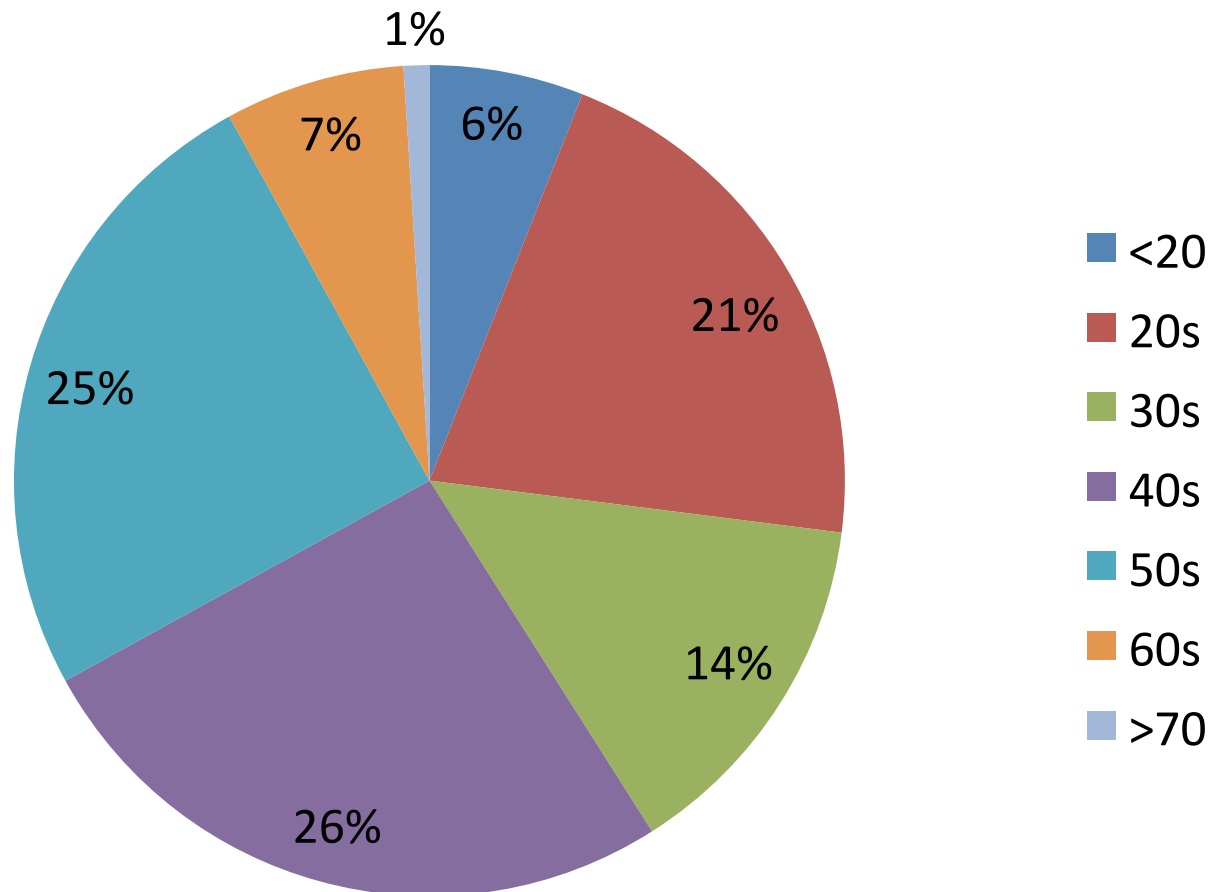

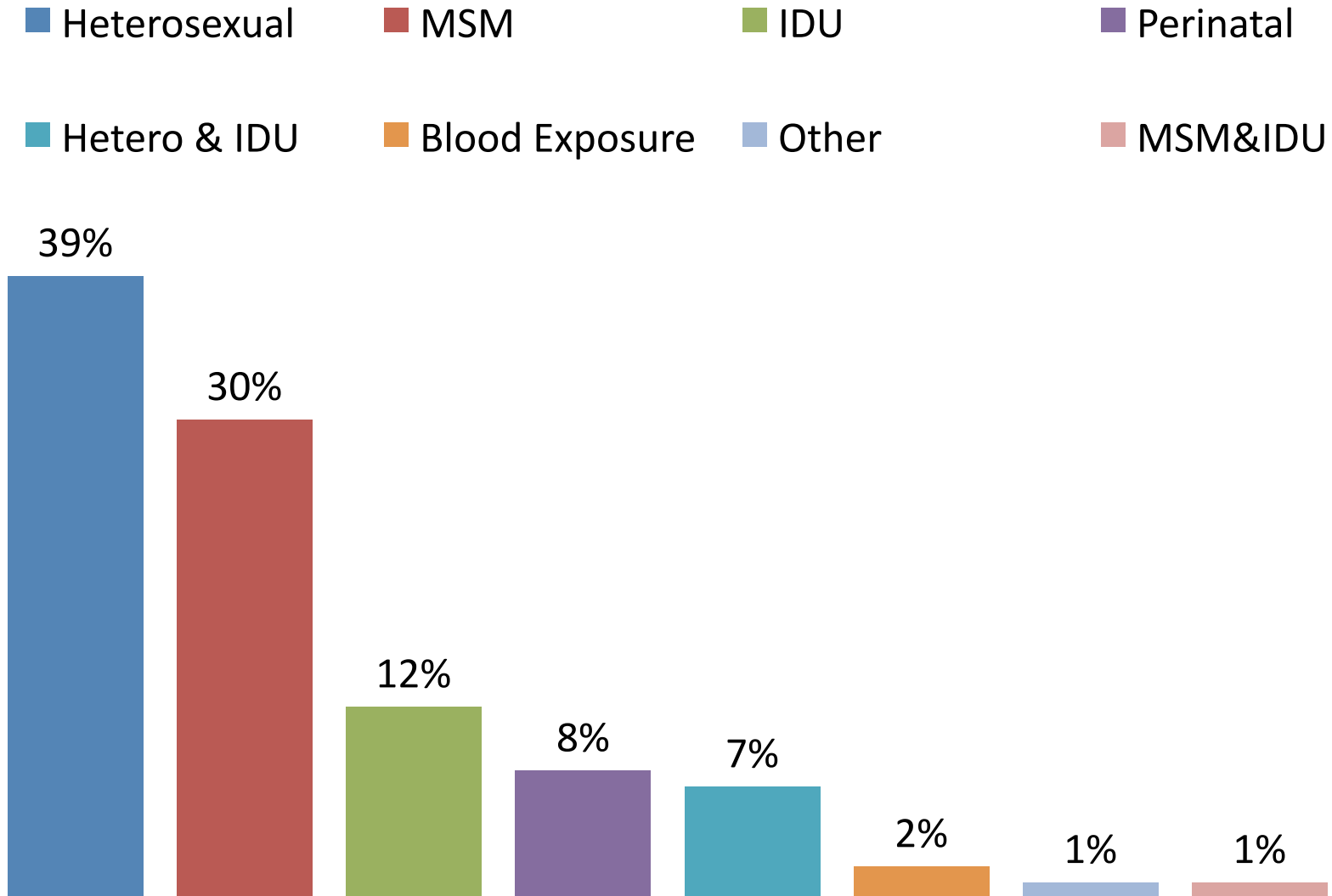

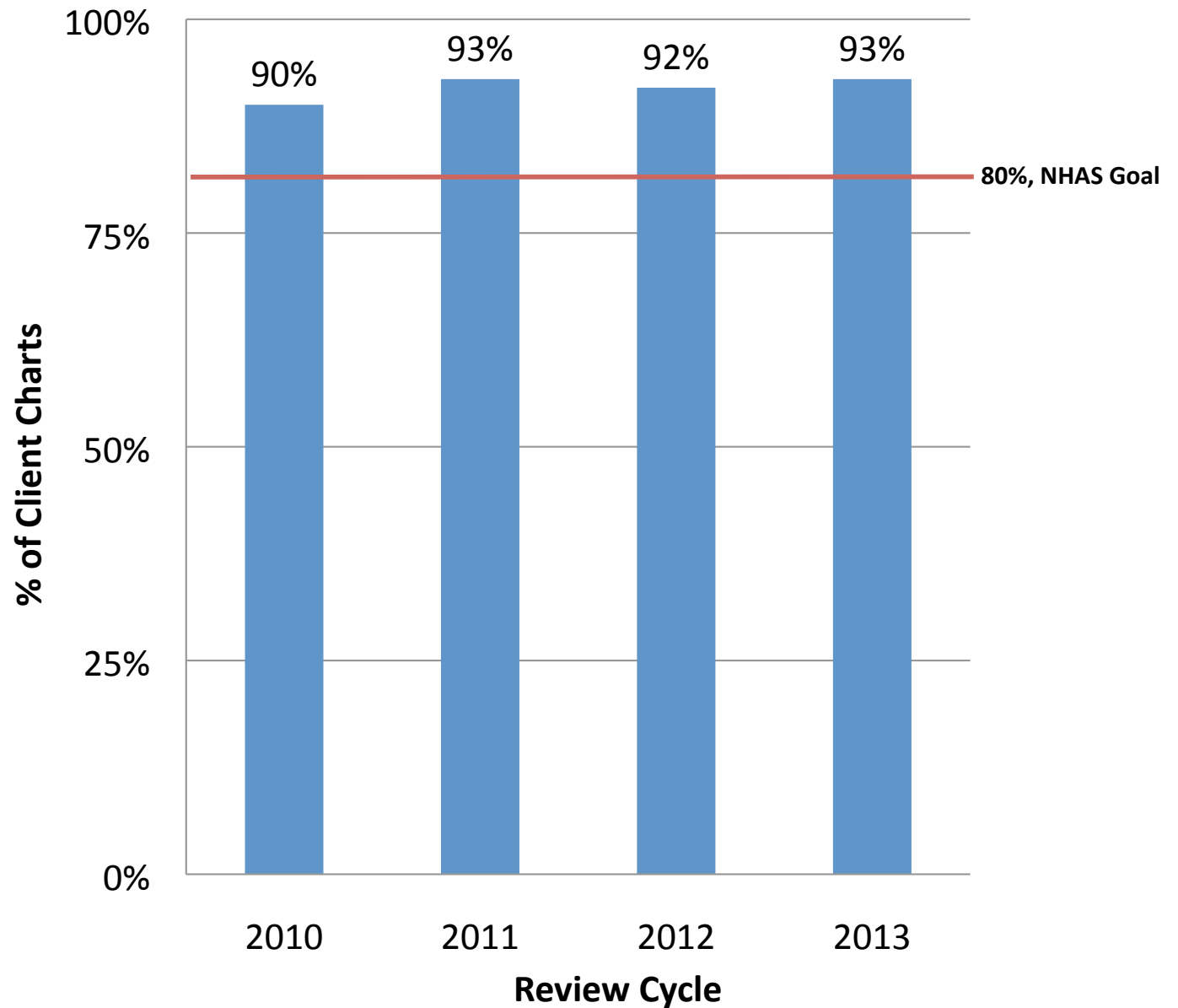
HIV RISK BEHAVIOR

Medical Visits N=364

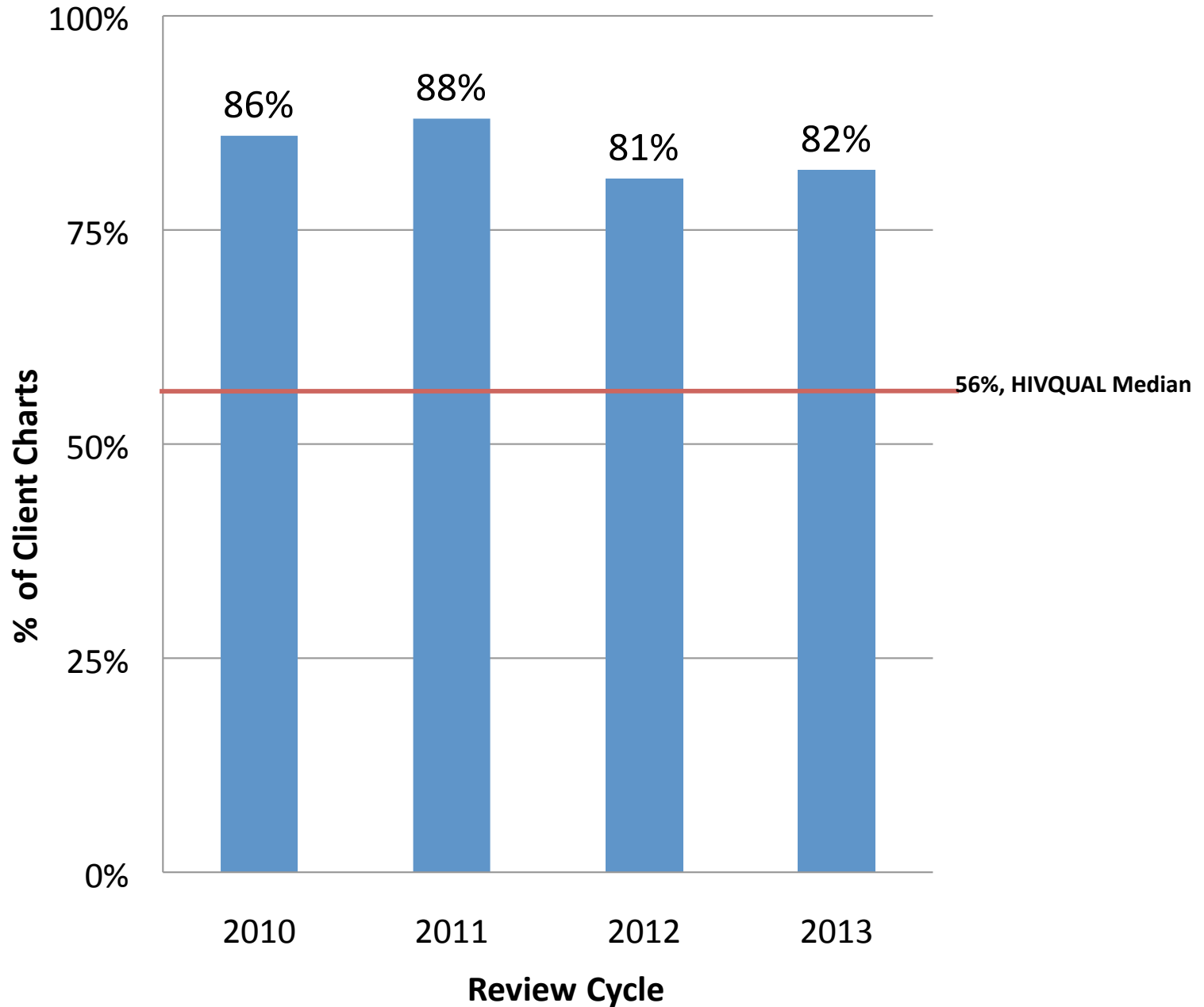
% of clients with HIV infection who had 2 or more medical visits at least 3 months apart in an HIV care setting in measurement year



CD4 Cell Count

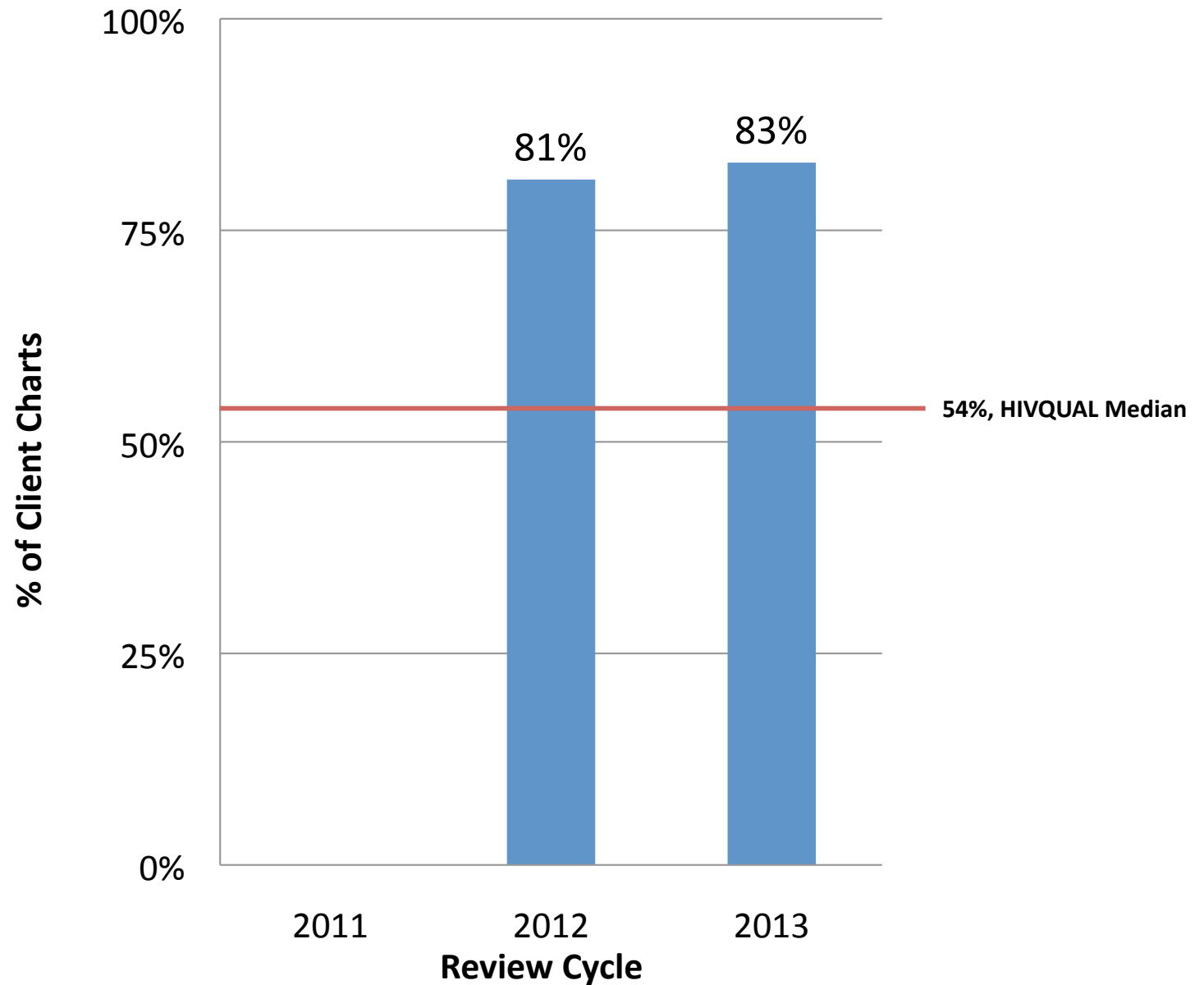

% of clients with HIV infection who had 2 or more CD4 cell counts performed at least 3 months apart during measurement year



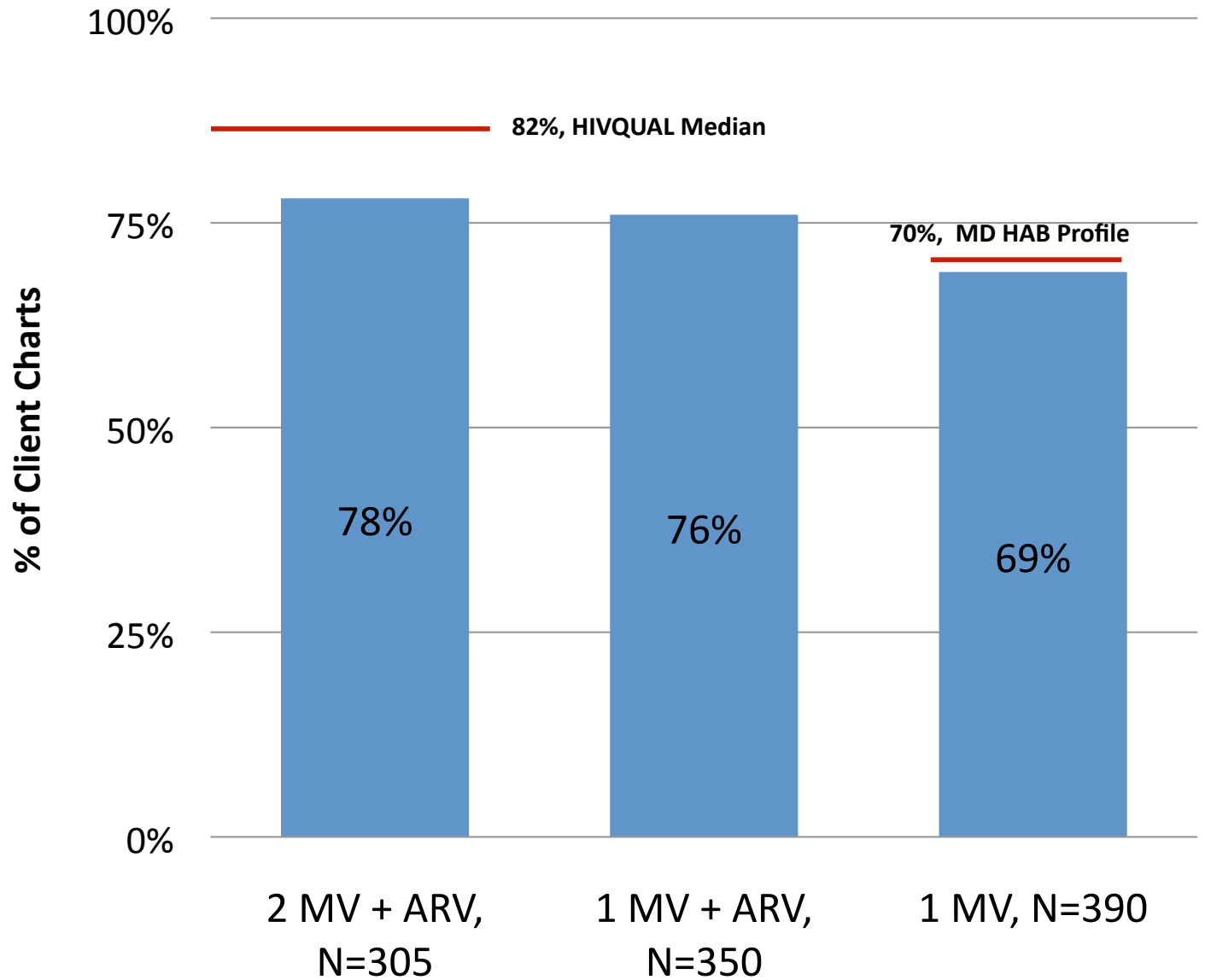
Viral Load Monitoring N=364

% of clients with HIV infection who had 2 or more VL tests performed at least 3 months apart during measurement year



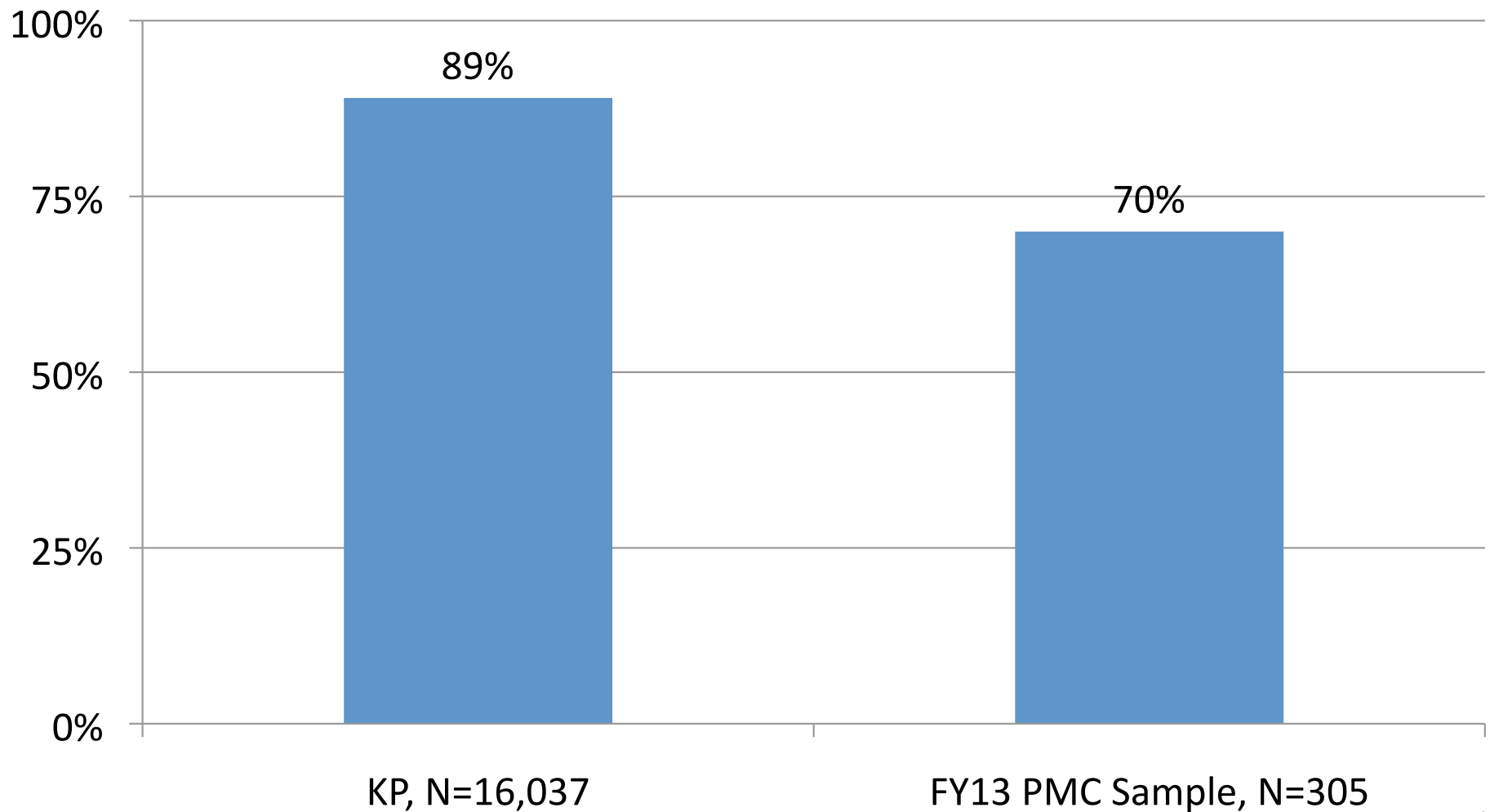
Viral Load Suppression on ART

% of clients with HIV infection with **VL <200 copies/mL** at last test



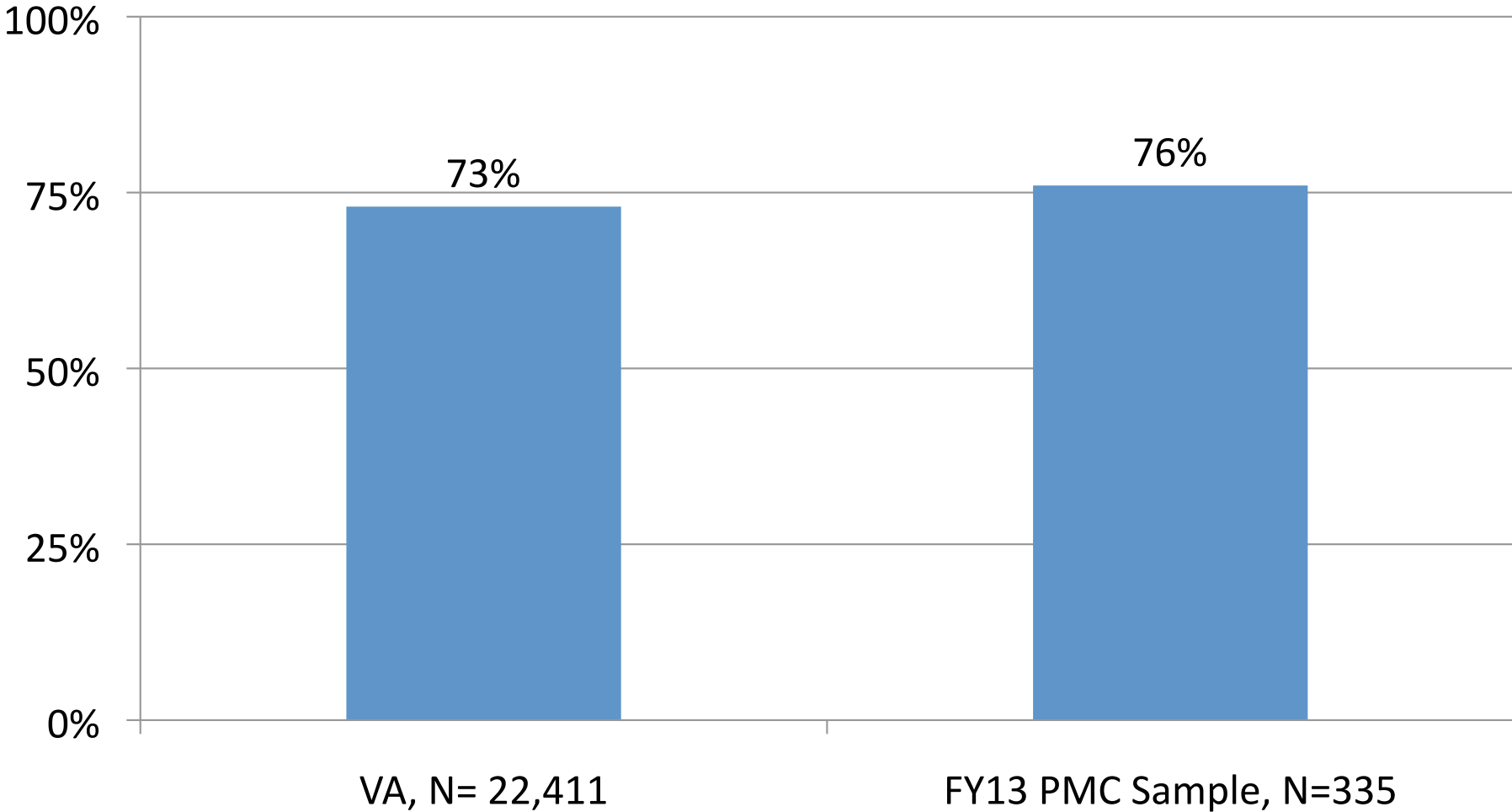
VL Suppression Comparison Kaiser Permanente

VL Suppression Comparison Veterans Administration

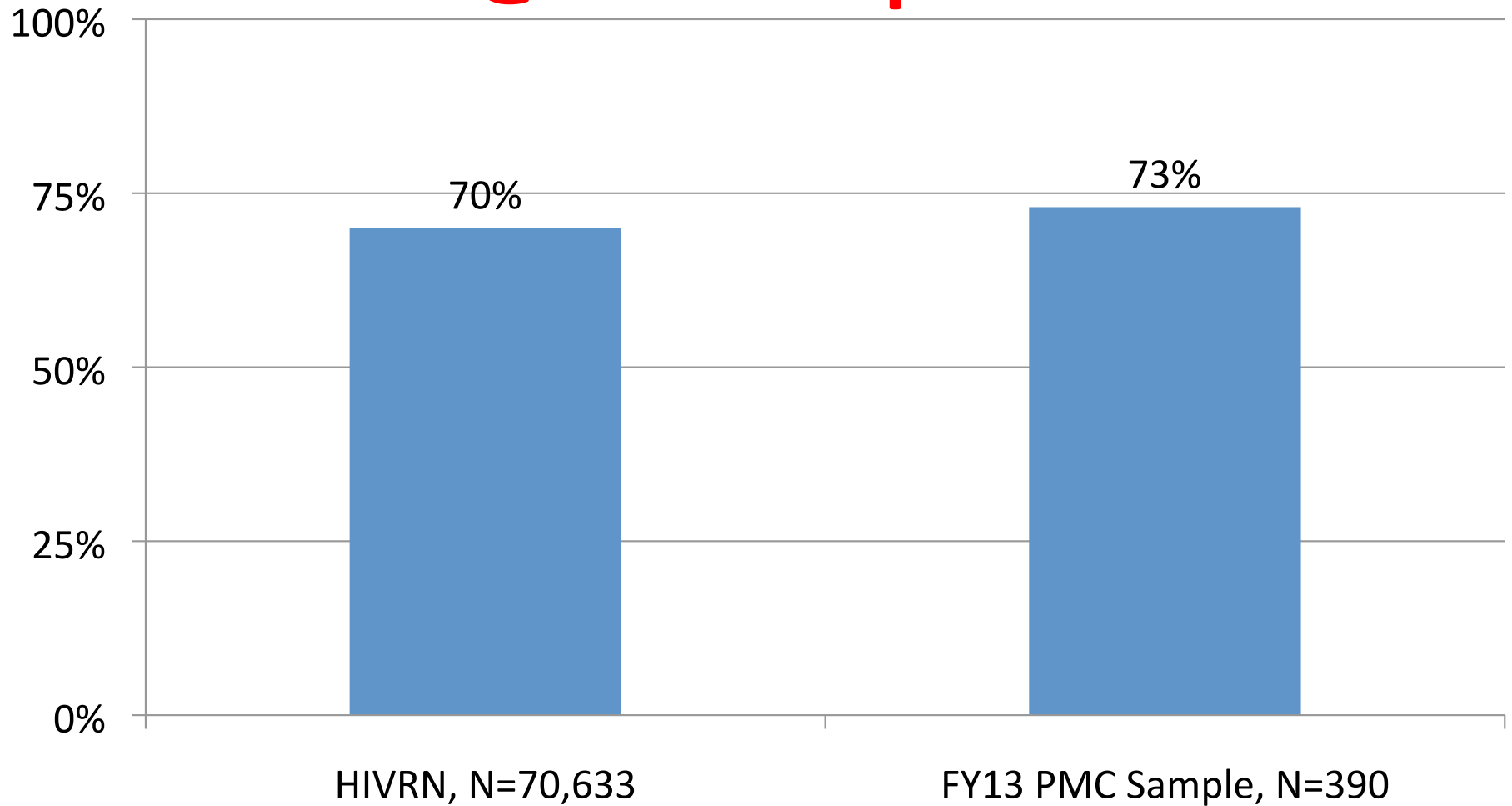

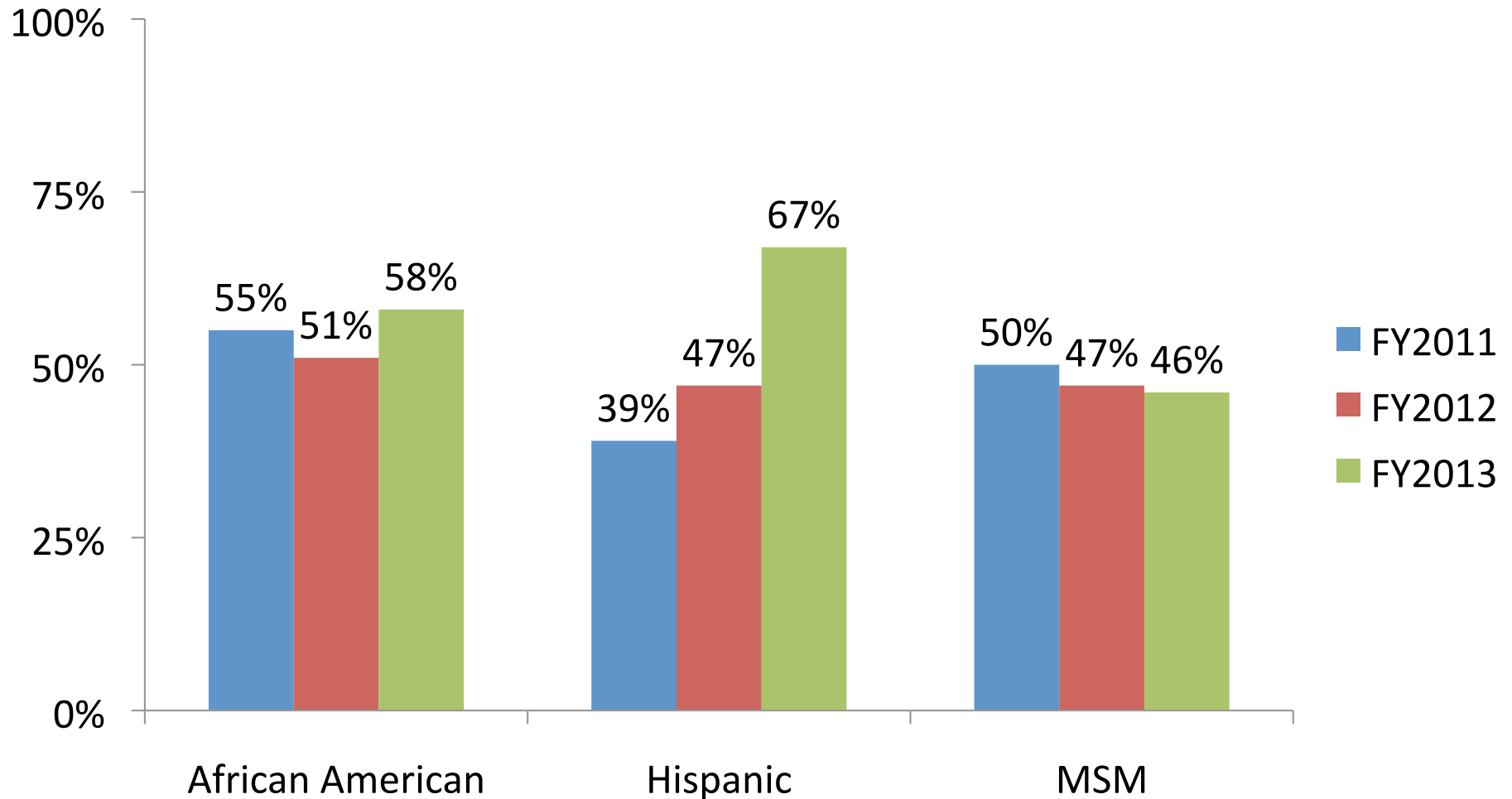

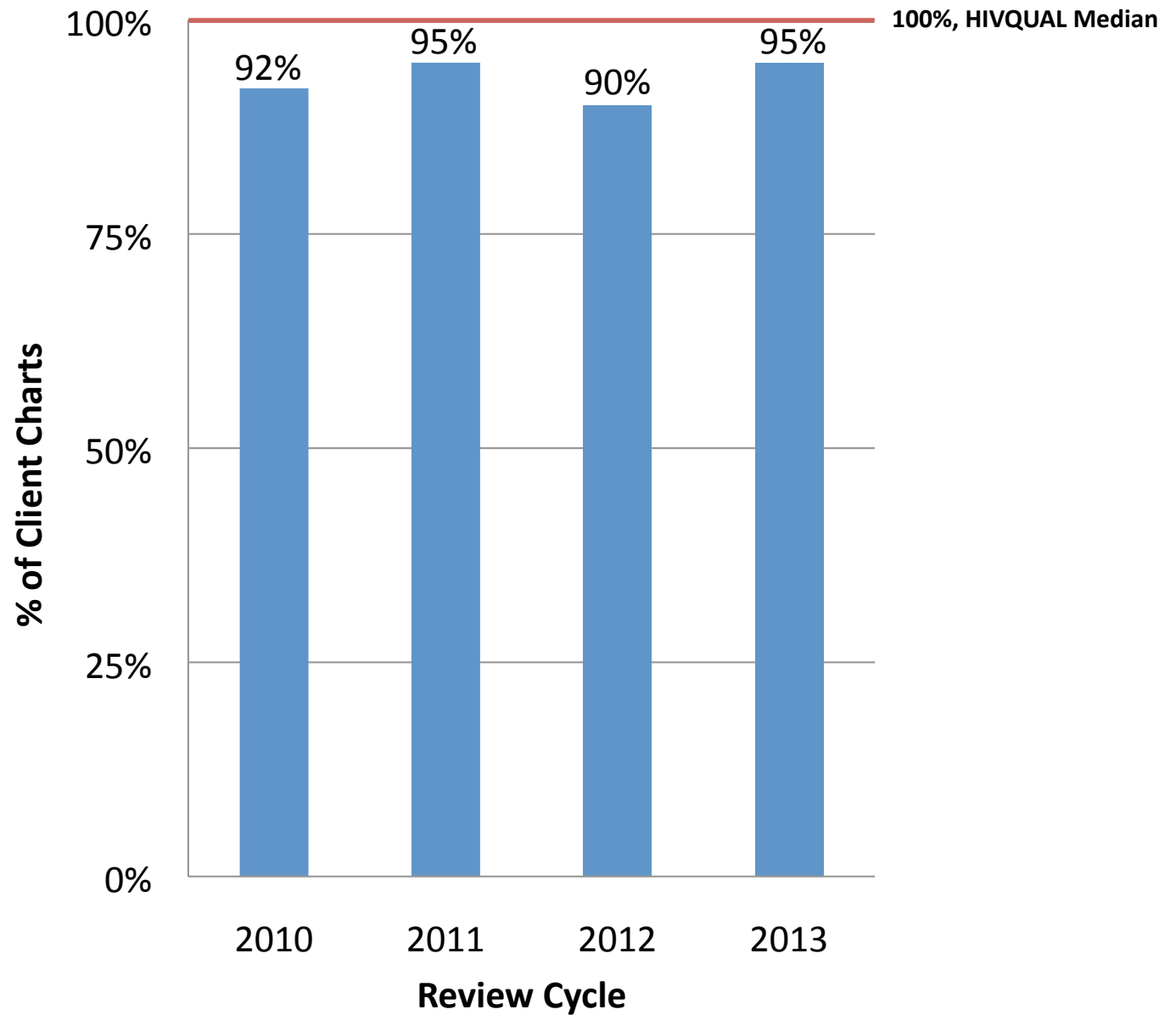
Undetectable VL (<50 copies) by NHAS Target Populations

regardless were on HAART

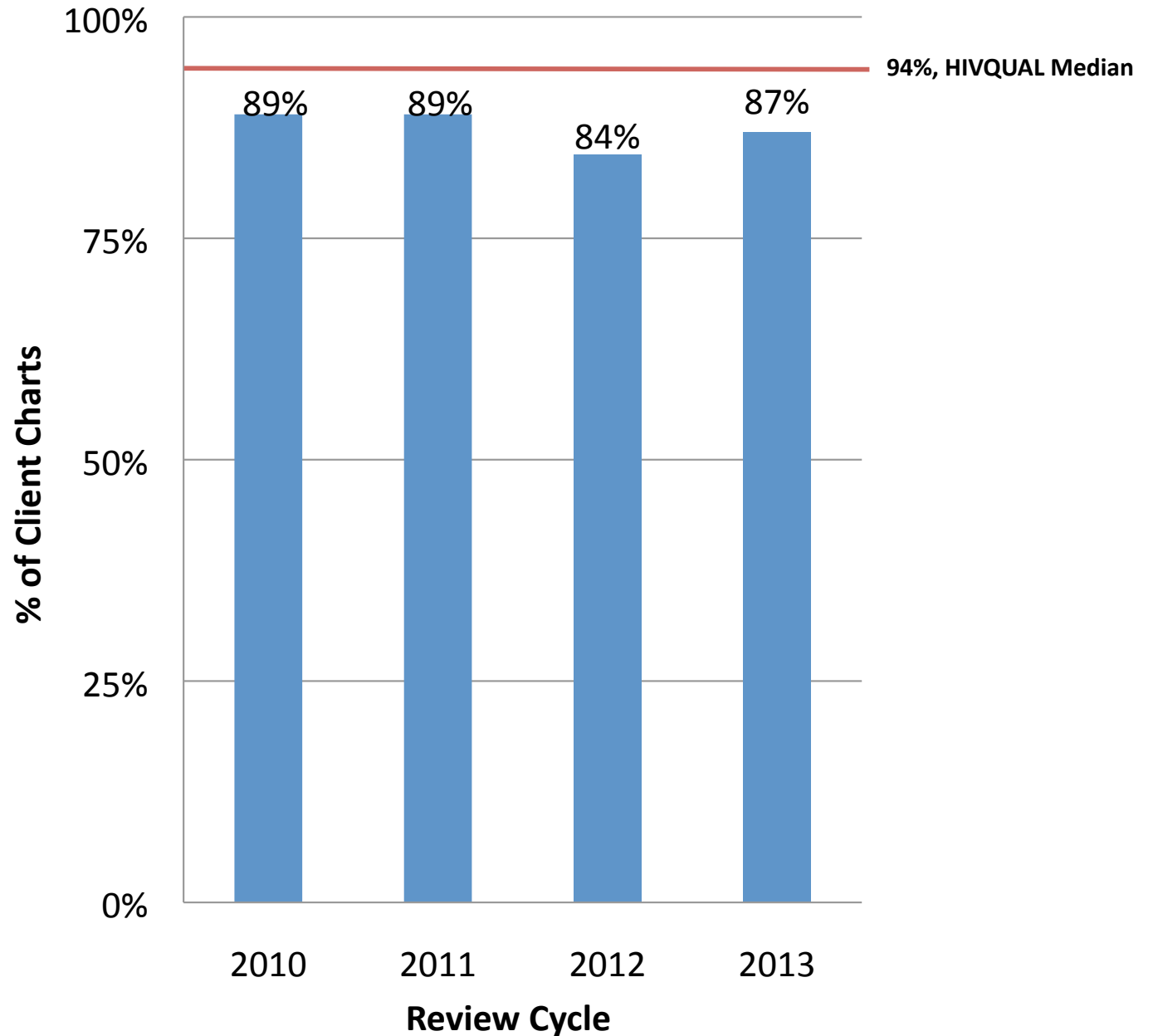


PCP Prophylaxis

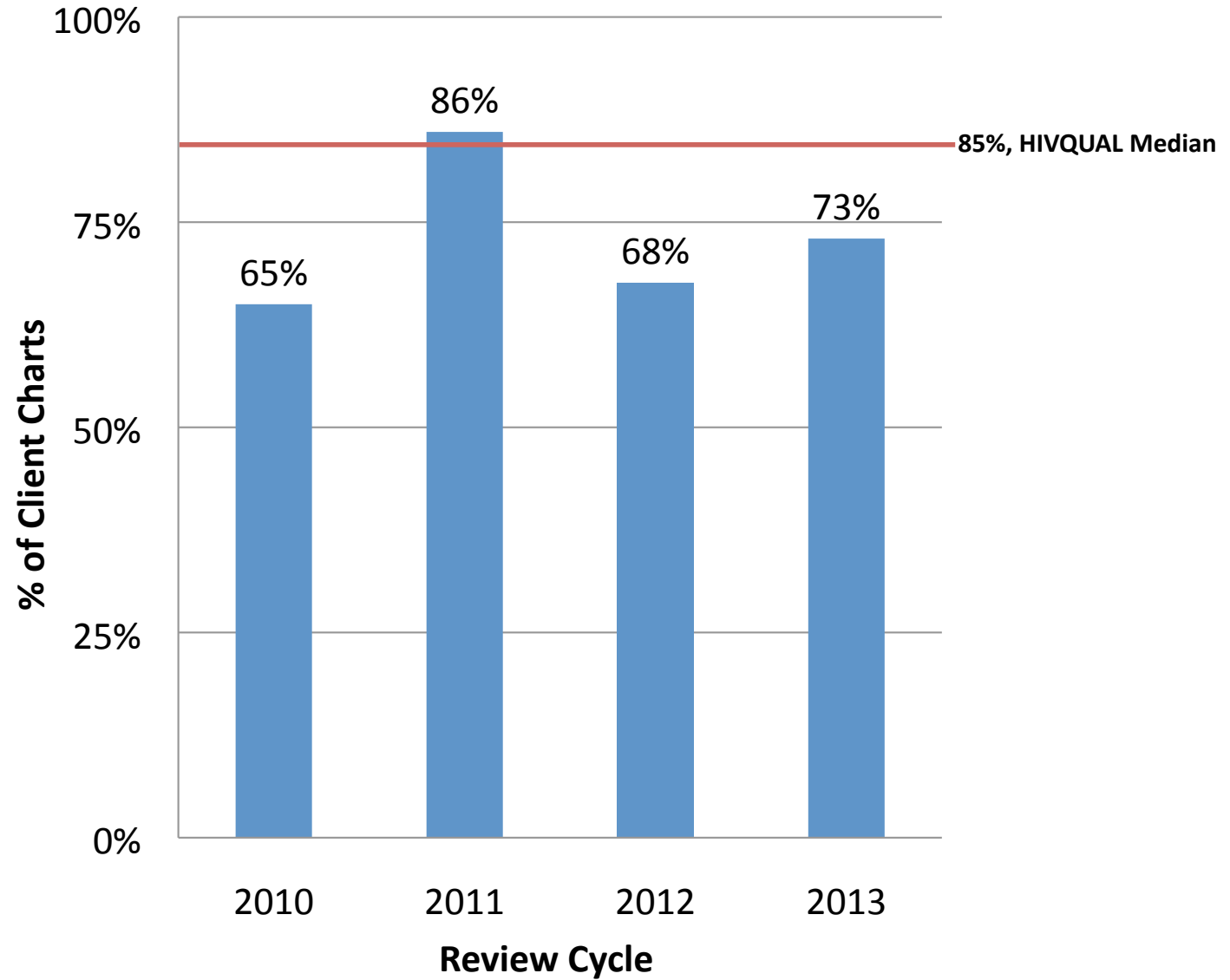
% of clients with HIV infection and a CD4 count below

200 cells/mm³ ever prescribed PCP prophylaxis

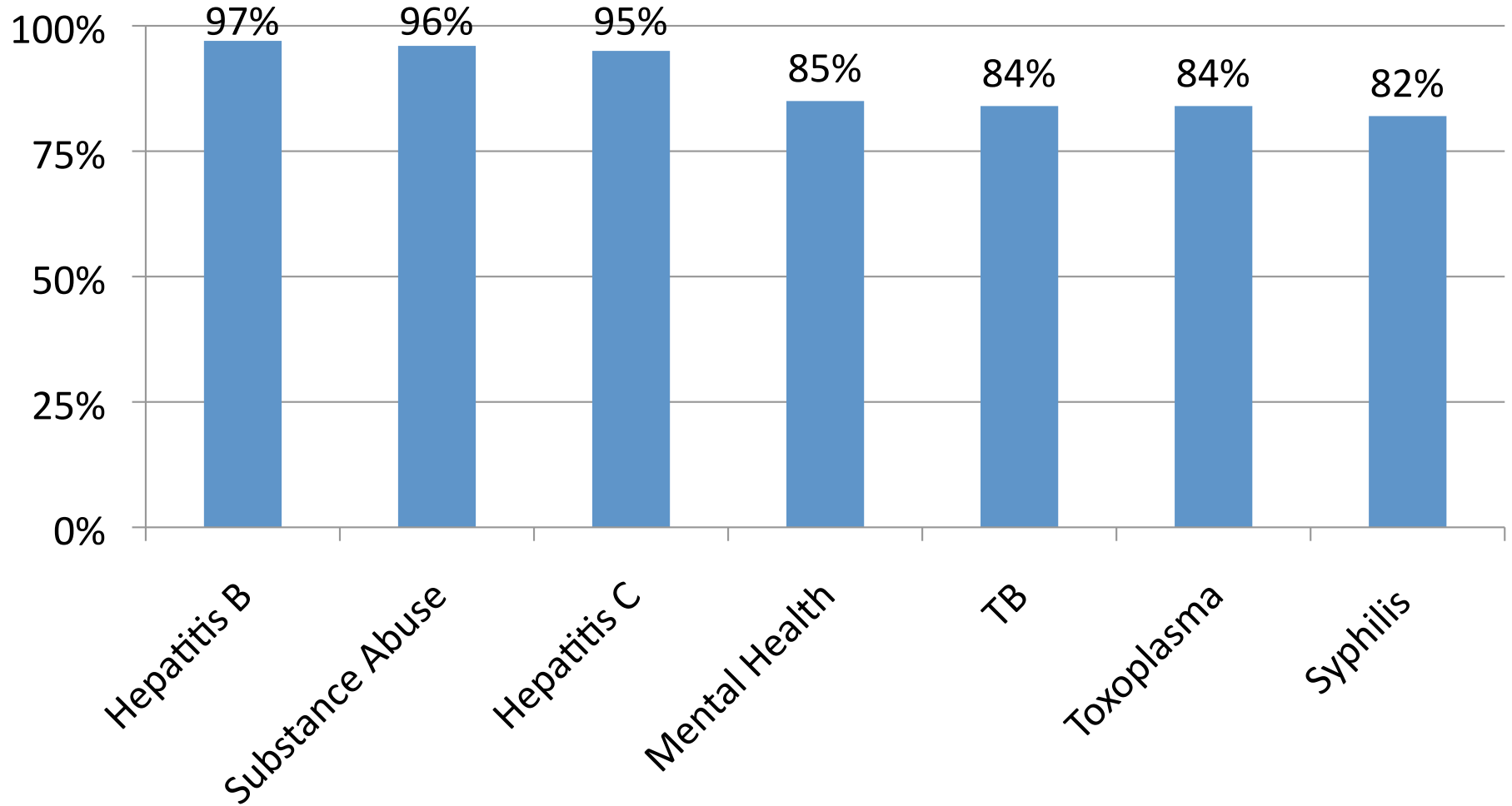


MAC Prophylaxis N=30

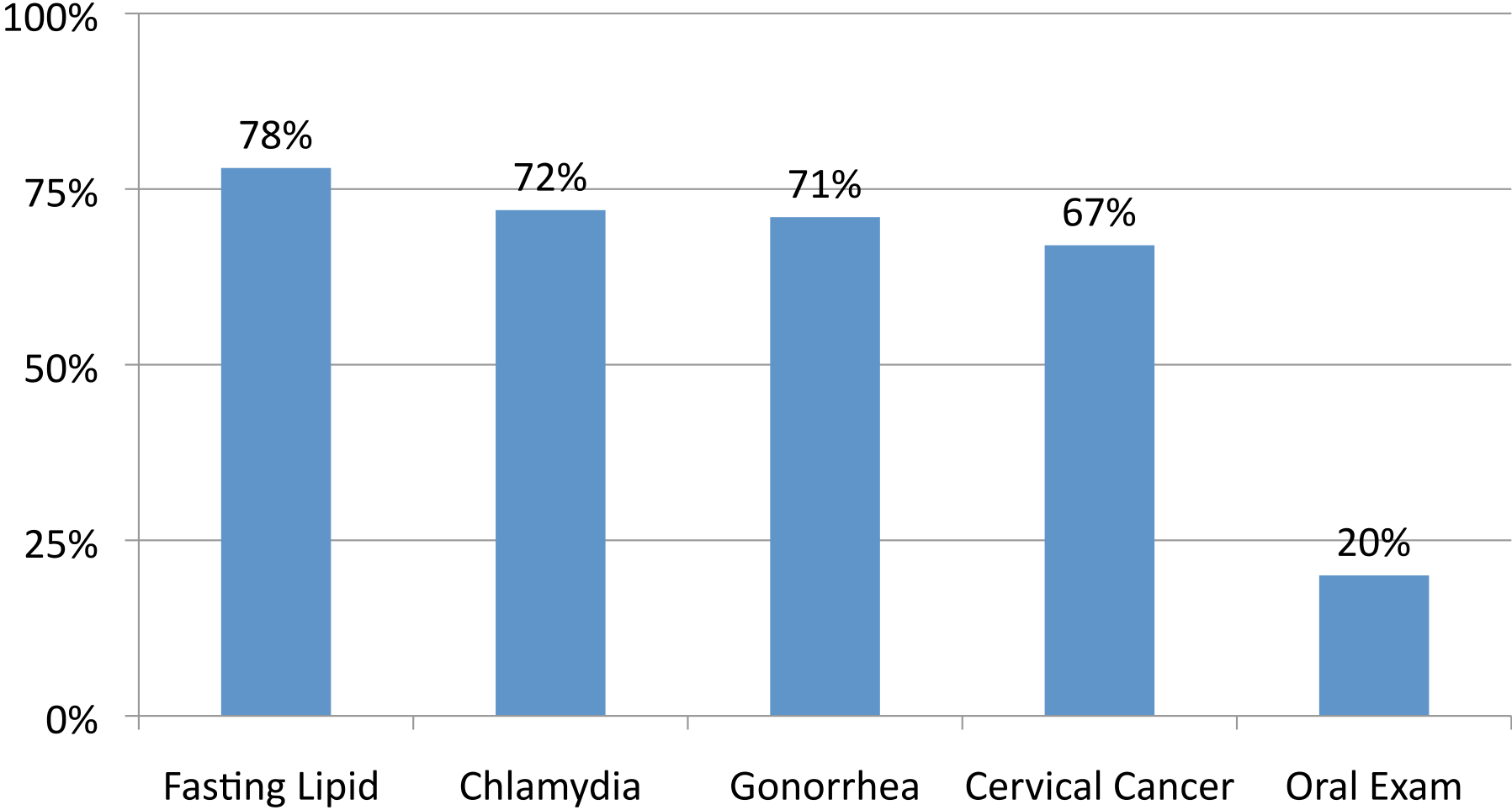
% of clients with HIV infection with CD4 count <50 cells/mm³ prescribed MAC prophylaxis within measurement year

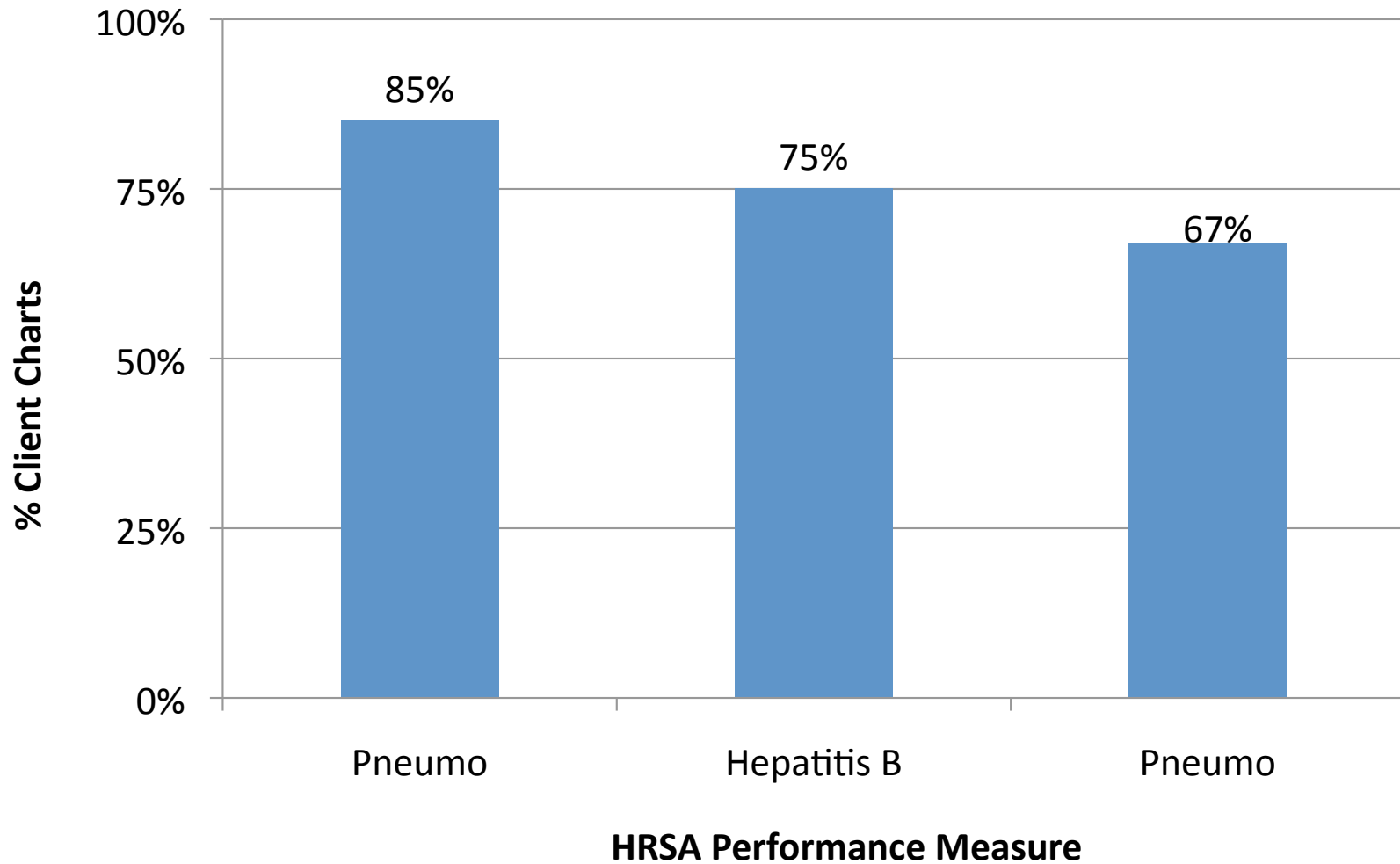

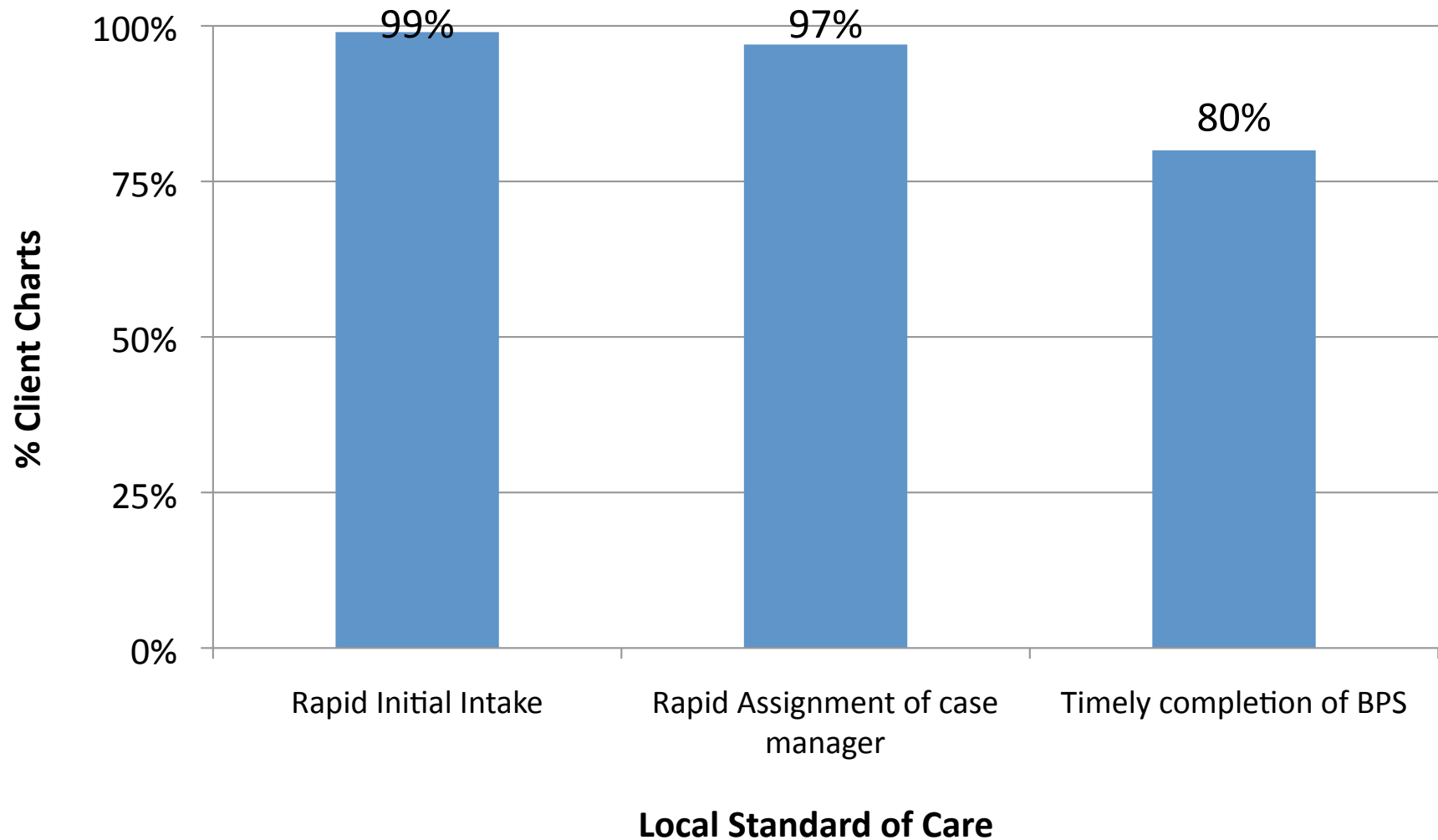

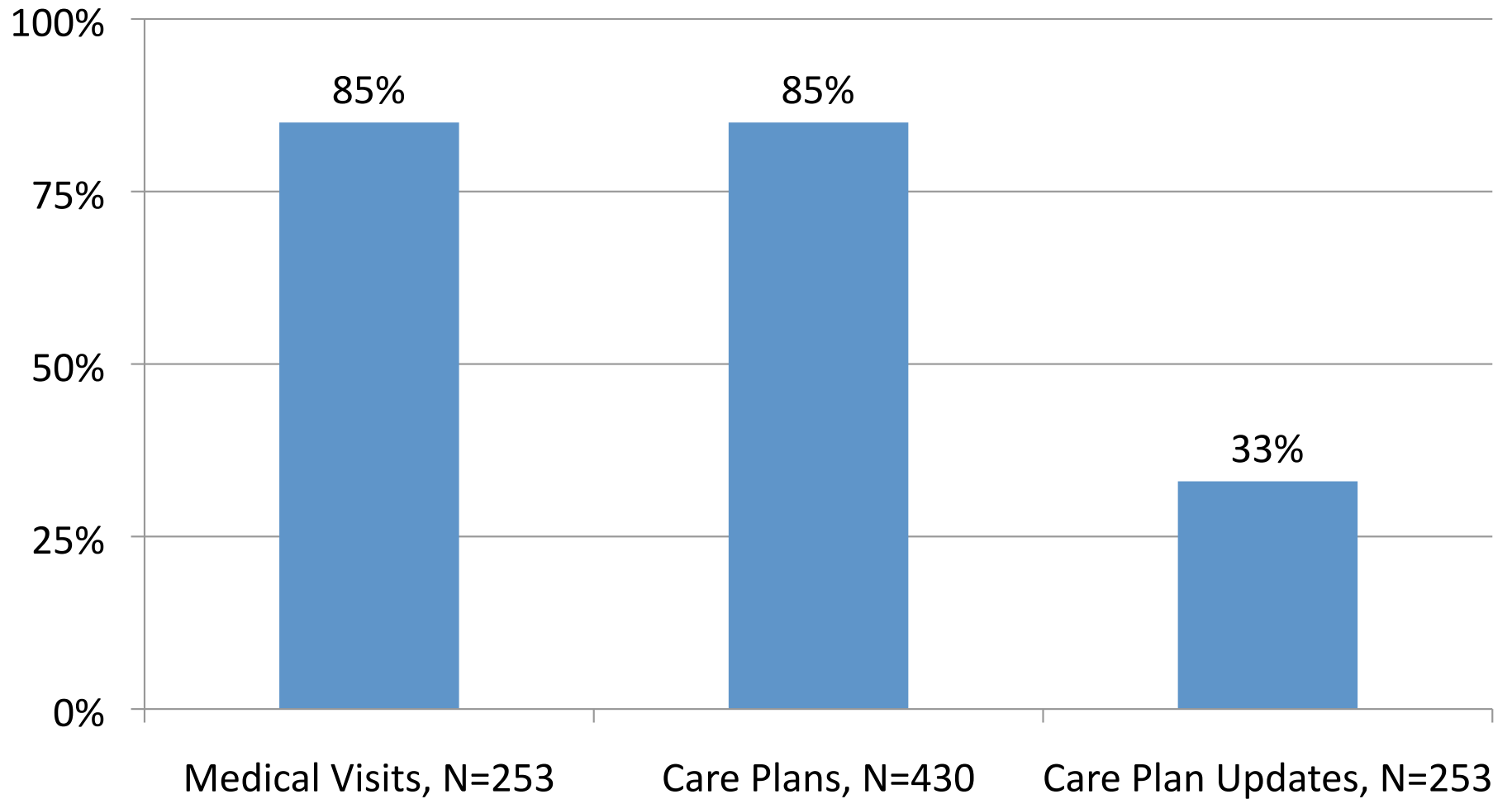

Medical Case Management



Medical Case Management

- Strengths
 - Initial assessment (99%) and assignment of case manager (97%) for new clients
 - Documentation of care plan (85%)
 - Case manager follow up (95%)
 - Medical Visits(85%)
 - Consumers are highly satisfied with services (94%)
- Improvement needed
 - Care plan details (resources) (53%)
 - Required elements in the bio psychosocial assessment

Medical Nutrition Therapy

- Strengths
 - MNT assessments (100%)
 - Nearly all consumers considered their health improved because of MNT services
- Improvement needed
 - Care Planning (65%)
 - Annual BIA (65%)

Legal Services

- Strengths
 - Documentation of legal situation and needs (100%)
 - Advocacy on behalf of client (100%)
 - Timely completion of legal intake (97%)
 - All consumers indicated they had a primary care provider
 - Consumers reported legal staff kept them informed about their case (91%)
- Improvement needed
 - Documentation of referrals for legal representation when an SS application is denied (67%)

Food Bank EFA

- Strengths
 - Nearly all consumers considered their health improved because of FB EFA services
- Improvement needed
 - Documenting the emergency need (73%)
 - Checking for other resources (37%)
